The Kindle DX is larger with a 9.7-inch screen and its weight is twice that of the other models, but retains its hallmark portable feature. It is a thin device with an accelerometer for seamless rotation of pages across landscape and portrait orientation, accomplished by just turning it on its side. It is excellent for displaying newspaper content and also supports PDF files. Kindle DX graphite comes in a graphite-colored case that allows better contrast perception.

The latest Kindle Fire

The Kindle Fire, launched in September 2011, is a tablet version with a seven-inch multi-touch color display. It is Amazon's first Kindle that has an IPS display instead of the more commonly used E-Ink display. Based on the Android operating system, the ultra-slim device provides access to streaming movies, TV shows and Amazon's Appstore. With a storage capacity of 8GB and expected battery life of about 8 hours, this product is available for just about \$199. It does not have an SD slot, a 3G option, a microphone or a camera. It has a built-in application for webmail and includes a cloud-browser called Amazon Silk. With support for multiple media formats, Kindle Fire allows you to read eBooks, view pictures, listen to songs and watch videos. It bridges the gap between an e-Reader and a computer with its impressive features. Apart from millions of books and comics, Amazon allows you to access interactive magazine editions on this device.
